



Welcome to the very first issue of our Newsletter which we hope to send out to you every two months. It is our way of keeping you abreast of events that have happened at Acorn and fundraisers that we are hoping to hold in the future.

As we are a working farm, we often have news of new arrivals, changes to our buildings and produce for sale and are often asked "what is happening at the moment?" Now we can keep you informed.

We are always happy to welcome visitors to look around, with prior notice so, pop down if you have time - we would love to see you!

Acorn Community Care provides sheltered work-based training in horticulture, falconry and animal husbandry for adults (18+) with learning and physical disabilities in Ryedale. We help build communicative competence and widening horizons through practical activities which develop appropriate social skills. The underlying conditions range from autism spectrum disorders (ASD) to brain damage. Individuals are encouraged to reach their potential and gain confidence and independence through aided projects on the farm. We encourage healthy eating and learn about where our food comes from, how it is reared and cared for to produce a quality product. We provide respite care in our 5 bedroomed farmhouse set in the lovely, peaceful countryside. We often organise trips such as The Great Yorkshire Show and offer supported holidays at home and abroad each year for those wishing to participate. Started in April 2013, our Domiciliary Care Service provides support to individuals who have made that important step to move into their own home. A personalised service is developed to help people live as independently as possible, accessing facilities in their local community to achieve a full and active life. As we are a charity, we rely on grants and fundraising to provide a homely and friendly atmosphere for our service users to blossom in. The time and money we spend here is repaid many times over in lives changed and in benefits to the local community.



Two of our purebred Saddleback sows produced 20 piglets between them in August this year. All are healthy and running around in their own enclosure. They are now enjoying the outdoor life here on the farm. We also have our own Pietrain x Duroc boar, a Large Black sow, and two more Saddleback sows one of which is due to give birth any day now along with a Tamworth sow, Betsy. Sleepless nights to come!
